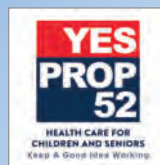

This November, voters will face \$3 Billion in Annual Taxes and \$31.9 billion in tax-increasing bonds on local ballots. That's 228 tax measures along with the 193 bonds that would dramatically increase annual property taxes. And these bonds place a lien against homes to guarantee repayment.

Taxpayers will want to examine these tax measures carefully and ask themselves if there is a genuine need for even higher

taxes in our already high tax state. Also, voters should ask if those who will be spending the money have shown a record of responsible spending and fiscal restraint.

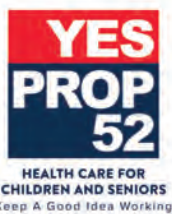
